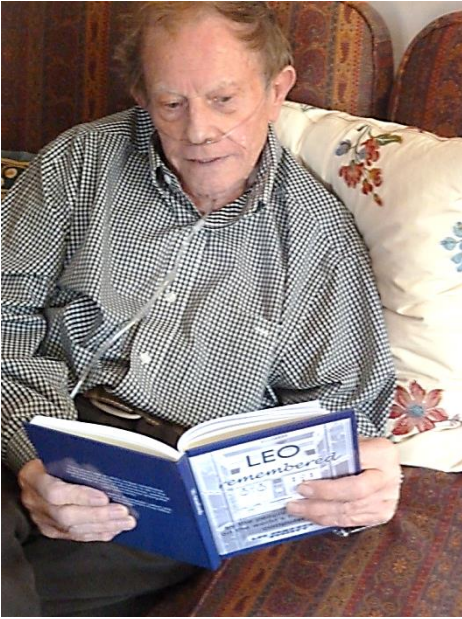


'LEO Remembered' published!

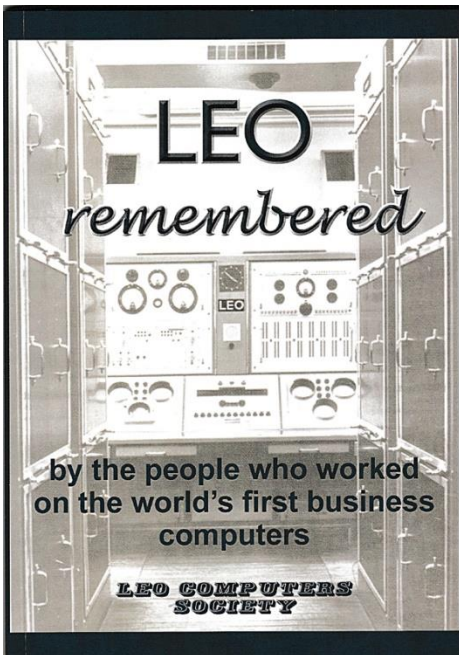

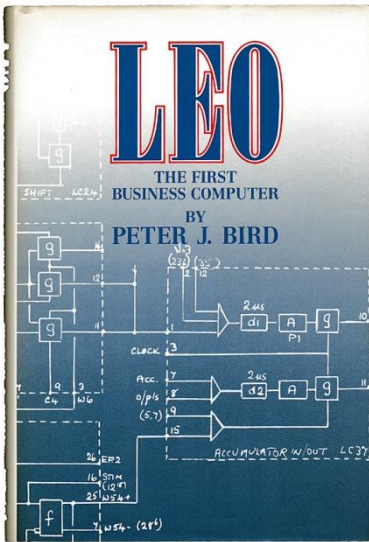
